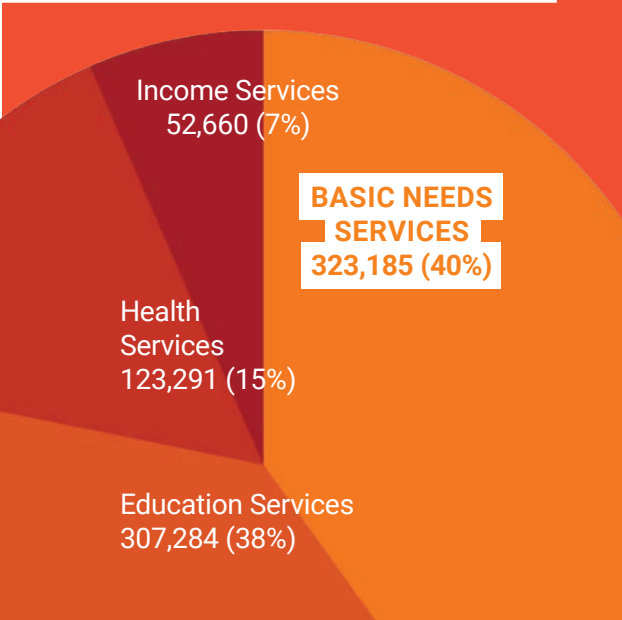

WE ARE A COMMUNITY DEDICATED TO SUPPORTING THE BASIC NEEDS OF RESIDENTS.

United Way of Brazoria County (UWBC) collaborates with community partners to mobilize resources, finding sustainable solutions that lead to a higher quality of life. The focus of UWBC's mission is divided across four pillars of impact: Education, Income, Health, and Basic Needs.

We fight for basic needs. Our work supports residents with rent and utilities assistance. We address immediate crisis and a means to stability with food, clothing, and shelter. We jump to action after disasters, providing relief to the residents affected, including disaster case management and assistance.

To accomplish this impact, we **partnered last year with 22 local programs to provide 323,185 basic needs services** to Brazoria County children, youth and adults.

In addition to our support of community partner programs, UWBC also collaborates with local business to meet unexpected crisis. In Sept. 2017, UWBC partnered with the Brazos Mall, the Brazosport Ministerial Alliance, The Dow Chemical Company Dow Texas Operations, Events All Around, LLC, and The Facts to bring a **centralized donations drop-off site** to benefit Brazoria County residents recovering from the impacts of Hurricane Harvey.
