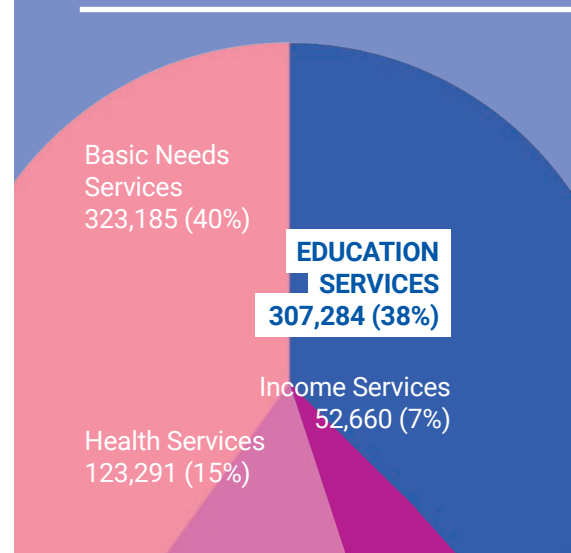
We fight for education. Our work increases access to affordable childcare and early learning opportunities. We create opportunities for children to excel in school and provide after-school and mentoring programs for at-risk youth. We also address school readiness, and workforce development and job training for

students transitioning into the workforce.

To accomplish this educational impact, **we partnered last year with 20 local programs to provide 307,284 education services** to Brazoria County children, youth and adults.

In addition to our support of community partner programs, UWBC also hosts local Read Across America Day volunteer opportunities every March in partnership with Brazoria County Head Start Learning Schools, Inc. (BCHS). Last year, UWBC volunteers read to over 200 students in Alvin, Angleton, Lake Jackson, and Sweeny.
