

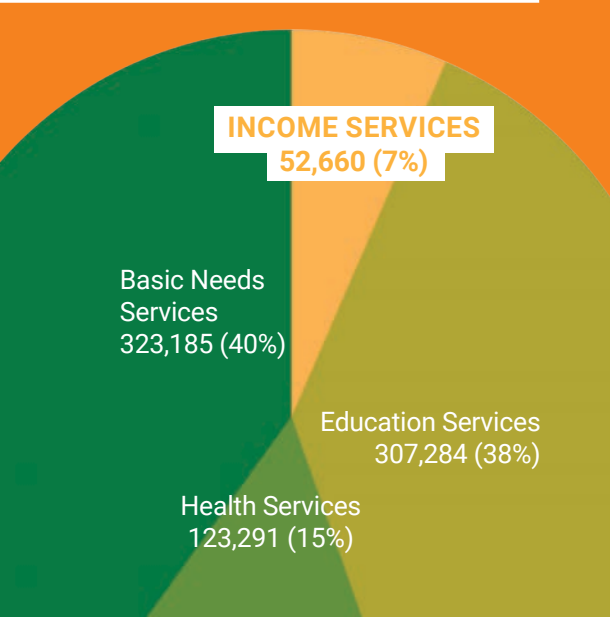

WE ARE A COMMUNITY DEDICATED TO PROMOTING FINANCIAL STABILITY.

United Way of Brazoria County (UWBC) collaborates with community partners to mobilize resources, finding sustainable solutions that lead to a higher quality of life. The focus of UWBC's mission is divided across four pillars of impact: Education, Income, Health, and Basic Needs.

We fight for financial stability. Our work promotes financial stability education. We address increasing access to affordable housing for individuals and families. We are dedicated to helping hardworking people obtain job training and family sustaining wages.

To accomplish this financial impact,

we partnered last year with 13 local programs to provide 52,660 income services to Brazoria County children, youth and adults.

UWBC also provides financial stability classes across Brazoria County. These classes provide attendees with the tools needed to make financially responsible decisions. We use real-world examples to teach the basics of banking, saving, and consumer rights.

These courses are provided free of charge to participants through the generous financial support of Wells Fargo and through the time and talent of local volunteers.
